MR. FRED BAETGE is presently Director of Bands at Pasadena High School. Previous teaching assignments include New Braunfels High School, Edinburg High School, Rayburn High School, San Jacinto College, and J. Frank Dobie High School. A Bachelor of Music Ed. and Master of Education were earned at Southwest Texas State University. Advanced work has been done at the University of Houston and Sam Houston State Univ. During 18 years of teaching, bands with whom Mr. Baetge has been associated have been awarded the Division I rating at various U.I.L. and other contests 49 times. Mr. Baetge is active as a professional musician in the Houston area and has performed professionally for 34 years. He is also active as a judge and clinician for various types of contests and clinics in the Gulf Coast area. Professional memberships include: Texas Music Educators Assoc., Tx. Bandmasters Assoc., Tx. State Teachers Assoc., National Assoc. of Jazz Educ., and the Houston Professional Musicians Assoc. Honorary memberships include Phi Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi, and Phi Beta Mu. In addition, Mr. Baetge is the present TMEA Band Div. Chairman for Region XIX.

MR. TOMMY GORSUCH has been the Director of the South Houston High School Band since 1958. Previous to that he was the Band Director at Jackson Jr. High from 1950-58. At Jackson, the band was a consistent First Division winner in Marching, Concert, and Sight Reading Contest. Mr. Gorsuch was a musician in the U.S. Navy Band at the Navy Air Station at Corpus Christi during World War II. Afterwards, he traveled throughout the Mid-West and Texas as a professional musician playing at many of the top hotels and ballrooms. He received his Bachelor's Degree at Northern State Teachers Col. in Aberdeen, South Dakota, and his Master of Music Degree from Southern Col. of Fine Arts in 1955. Mr. Gorsuch is a member of the Tx. State Teachers Assoc., Tx. Classroom Teachers Assoc., Pasadena Classroom Teachers Assoc., Tx. Bandmasters Assoc., Tx. Music Educators Assoc., National Education Assoc., and a member of Kappa Delta Phi.
